

CACAO TREE:



Find in the Palm House

The fruit are pods that contain the chocolate beans.

Each pod contains 40 beans – it takes 400 beans to make 1 pound of chocolate!

BANANA PLANT:



Find in the Tropical House

A cluster of bananas is called a hand – a single banana is called a finger.

The banana plant doesn't have a true "trunk". Its base is really the many layers of overlapping leaves.

PERUVIAN APPLE CACTUS:



Find in the Desert House

Fruit has a fluffy cotton candy texture. It looks and tastes like a kiwi.

In its native habitat, it's flower is pollinated by bats or moths.

AVACADO TREE:



Find in the Palm House

The fruit of this tree is used to make guacamole and is also called an Alligator Pear – due to its shape and rough green skin.

COCONUT PALM:



Find in the Palm House

Coconut is a yummy fruit that also gives us water, milk and cooking oil.

Coconut palms can grow up to 90 feet!

Trained pig-tailed macaques are sometimes used to harvest coconuts.

VANILLA ORCHID:



Find in the Show House

Used to make vanilla "flavoring" for the #1 ice cream flavor in the U.S.A.

Only 1 species of bee can pollinate this flower to produce the bean. Humans use a toothpick like stick to pollinate & produce more beans.

COFFEE TREE:



Find in the Tropical House

Coffee beans ripen at different rates so they have to be selectively picked by hand.

Fact: 1 tree produces only 1-2 pounds of coffee a year!

SWEET ORANGE:



Find in the Tropical House

The fruit of this tree is a good source of fiber, vitamin C and A.

The orange blossom flower is used to make perfume. Try rhyming with "Orange".

PRICKLY PEAR:



Find in the Desert House

This cactus is both fruit and vegetable. The watermelon tasting fruit is called "tuna". The vegetable green pad tastes like green beans.
